Onward and upward

The momentum we felt starting to build post-pandemic has continued throughout the year. We now find ourselves with a record 9,600+ members, a number we expect will continue to grow. As a society, we are grateful and exceptionally fortunate to have such dedicated and enthusiastic members.

Our online and digital offerings have continued to expand. The CIRSE Library now boasts over 11,000 titles. The CIRSE Academy added 13 new courses this year, bringing the total available courses to 59, with more in the works. The EBIR is able to accommodate more hopeful candidates than ever before, offering a fully remote exam format available in English, German, and Spanish. The European Curriculum and Syllabus for Interventional Radiology, on which the EBIR is based, was also updated with a third edition this year.

CIRSE's journals continue to gain popularity, with a record high impact factor for CVIR and a first-ever impact factor for CVIR Endovascular announced in 2023.

With the help of Next Research, CIRSE launched its Chronic Limb-threatening Ischemia treated with Intravascular Lithotripsy Observational Study (CALCIO) this year, marking its first venture into endovascular research. IASIOS, the International Accreditation System for Interventional Oncology, also continued to grow exponentially and recently accredited its first US centre.

As for our meetings – you were there! From ECIO to ET, ICCIR, ESIR, and of course, the CIRSE Annual Congress, we could not have asked for a better year.

An eye towards the future

During the CIRSE 2023 Opening Ceremony, I spoke about CIRSE's five-year vision for the future of IR. It is imperative that we expand further into clinical services and patient care, that we focus on IR therapies and treatment, and that we continue to place an emphasis on training and excellence in IR. Our plans are already in motion, and the wheels will continue to turn after my time in office concludes next September. For the remaining year of my presidency, I look forward to continuing to work together with all of you in the endeavour of making our vision for the bright future of IR a reality.


Fellowship grants
