CIRSE Standards of Practice on Nephrostomy and Ureteric stent Placement and Exchange

Obstructive uropathy is a common pathology of the genitourinary system. If untreated, it leads to renal impairment, end-stage renal failure, and death. Percutaneous nephrostomy is a well-established procedure to obtain access to the renal collecting system and the procedure of choice for the infected obstructed kidney. 
